F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

N OSLO01:

The University of Oslo employs either a granding scale with letter values or a grading scale irh only pass/fail values in the assessment of examinations. **Pass/fail**The pass/fail scale is applied as an independent scale with only two possible results, and is not connected to the letter grades.

Letter grades

The grading scale with letter values is a descending scale where A is the best grade, E the lowest pass grade and F is fail. The assessment is based on defined, qualitative criteria for each grade in the grading scale.

Below you find the general, qualitative descriptions of the criteria used in the assessment of examinations. Each subject area may have specified more detailed criteria for the assessment.
