- A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [8] weeks
 after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed
 five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 4. Termination of the agreement The inter-institutional agreement may be amended by mutual agreement. The inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by either party. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. In the event of such notice being given, all existing commitments to staff or students will be fulfilled. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
