3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 8 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.

4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year shall be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agency can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

Even if grades are awarded on a scale of 0-20, the tradition is such that grades higher then 16/20 are very rare. Passes with High Honors (15-16/20) are also relatively few in number. The University does not calculate rank in class.
