1. Grading systems of the institutions

The results obtained by the student in each of the subjects will be graded according to the following numerical scale of 0-10, with one decimal, to which may be added the corresponding qualitative rating:

0 - 4,9: Suspenso (SS) - Failed

5,0 - 6,9: Aprobado (AP) - Satisfactory/Sufficient

7,0 - 8,9: Notable (NT) - Good

9,0 - 10: Sobresaliente (SB) - Very Good

The mention of "Distinction" (Matrícula de Honor) will be awarded to students who have achieved a score equal to or greater than 9.0. Its number will not exceed 5% of the students enrolled in a subject in the relevant academic year, unless the enrollment is less than 20 students, in which case only one student may be granted with this "Distinction".
